"I have nine brothers" and am eleven years old.

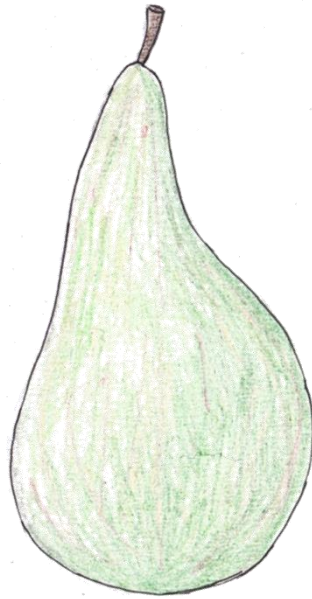
I have nine brothers as follow

"I will describe a day in my Easter holidays. I get up at 6.30am, have my breakfast, get my bicycle and ride to the ground which is about half a mile away."

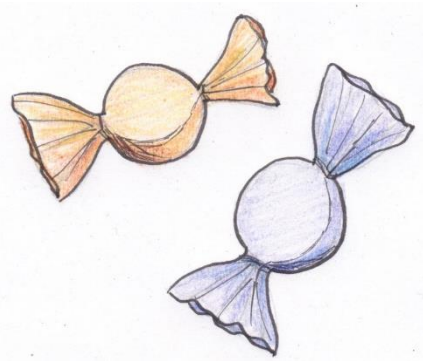

The **Second** World War began in 1939 and ended in 1945 (the First World War happened 20 years earlier).

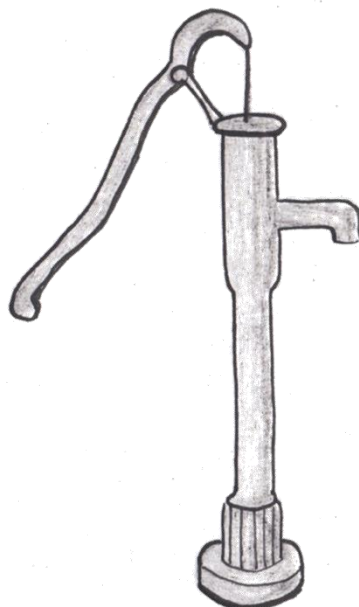
Market gardeners, farmers and men with other important jobs did **not** have to fight.

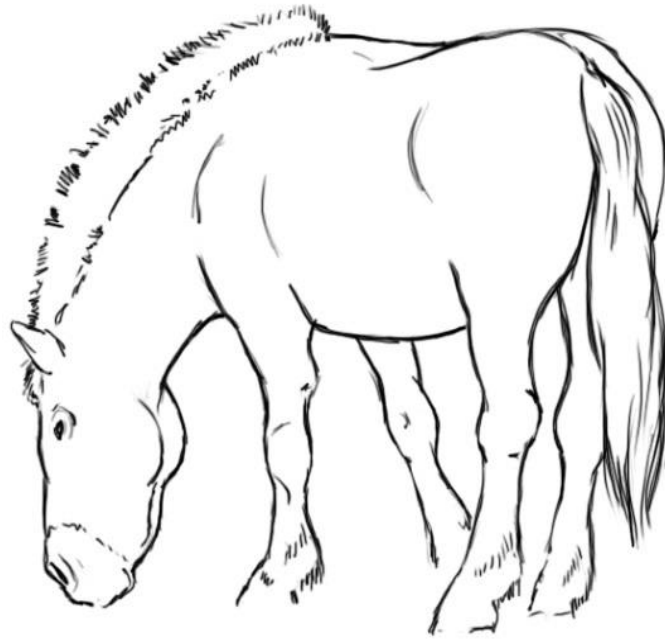
