10.00-10.05 Round up!

Hopefully everyone will arrive on time and staff will have directed you to the correct place meeting place, by the Local Studies reference books on level 2.

You may want to say whether you are interested in a specific aspect of local history e.g. trades, a place, natural history etc.

Use the 'Overview of Themes' diagram or search the catalogue on the level 2 catalogue search computer near the books, which has a white backing around it.

If you are unsure of a theme to pick, why not choose from the Elgar/music section at book ref: 780.942. This section is near the 'theatre' section on the diagram hand-out. Books on music in our local history are on display on the 'cube' shaped book stand.
